Bolesław Kacewicz (b. 1950) – professor of mathematics; graduate in 1974 of the Department of Mathematics, Informatics and Mechanics, University of Warsaw, where in 1976 he completed his PhD (Prof. H. Woźniakowski was his supervisor) and habilitation in 1988. His work focuses on computational mathematics, especially the computational complexity of continuous problems. He is the author of many publications in this field, many of them devoted to non-linear problems. He is currently on the faculty of the Department of Applied Mathematics at the AGH Stanisław Staszic University of Science and Technology in Cracow, Poland.

Leszek Plaskota (b. 1959) – professor of mathematics, graduate in 1983 and since then a member of the Department of Mathematics, Informatics and Mechanics, University of Warsaw. Plaskota was a scholarship recipient of both the Humboldt Foundation and the Fulbright Foundation.
